### FARWAY CHURCH BELLS

During a routine inspection of the Farway Church Bells it was found that remedial conservation work was required, the most urgent of which was that two of the six headstocks holding the bells were cracked and for safety reasons had to be taken away immediately to be welded. Work was also required to the bearing and clapper

 $\bigcirc$ 

away immediately to be welded. Work was also required to the bearing and clapper of the Tenor (6th bell which was cast in 1450) which was found to have a small crack. Further investigation by Nicholsons, the bell foundry at Bridport, showed this crack had been previously welded as part of the installation works carried out in 2001 and had not increased in size since then. All issues have now been resolved and the repaired headstocks returned. Unfortunately, the cost of this specialist conservation work was £2,300 which has to be paid out of church funds. 

Offwell School values its geographical position in the East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). We also value our school grounds and how we can help them be part of a sustainable environmental vision. Therefore, we have an Eco-Team - 10 children from across the school - whose remit is to see how we can best meet the needs of ourselves and the creatures and plants with which we share our world. The team meets regularly with our Headteacher, Mrs Legg, to talk about their ideas and seek ways to achieve their aims.

The team recently successfully applied for a One-Off Grant offered by the Axe Vale and District Conservation Society. The Society asked for submissions which supported their aim to work with local councils and environmental organisations for the benefit of pollinators.

The Eco-Team set out clearly the work they would like to undertake to improve the grounds of our school for the mutual benefit of insects, animals, plants and people. Below are two of the ideas they submitted:



In their response, confirming our success, the AVDCS stated that they 'feel passionately that the natural world is cherished, and that children are encouraged to have contact with their environment on every opportunity'. This sentiment matches the ethos of our school: 'Learning to Live Well', as, with our connection with the Offwell Woodland Education Trust, we encourage the children to share in the beauty and benefits of being in such a wonderful area, through our regular walks to Offwell Woods. We also remind children of the respect owed to nature, by not picking wildflowers and clearing up litter; educating children about the carefully balanced habitats within our environment, to help to our children become good citizens of the world.

Work on this project will commence shortly and we will keep you updated on its progress.



It is the time of year when much 'pricking-out' of seedlings takes place. I must issue a word of warning. When plantlets are large enough to handle, always take hold by a leaf never the stem. The stem is very soft and any undue finger pressure will bruise it and possibly 'kill' it. If you spoil a leaf another will grow – a spoilt stem is a dead seedling!

Another warning! It is the time of year for the Lily Beetle to do its devastating work, i.e. chew holes in the leaves of lilies and fritillarias. They are red, about lady-bird size but not so round, un-spotted and difficult to catch. If you fail to catch them they drop into the undergrowth underside up. The underside is black so difficult to see. To be sure of capture put one hand cupped under the leaf on which the beetle is browsing and use the other to pick it off the leaf. If it drops you can catch it, and then dispatch forthwith.

Dahlias should be coming on nicely by now. Plant out into well prepared holes and feed, not only a general fertilizer (N.P.K.) but a watering with potash (Potassium Phosphate) in the water. This chemical enhances the production of flowers. If you have very tall varieties of dahlia, they will need support. Put stakes in the planting hole before the plant otherwise there is a danger of piercing tubers to the detriment of the plant. Taking a break, I have just looked at a tray of Dahlia seed that I planted recently. The first germination leaves are up through the vermiculite (I always cover seed with vermiculite; it is light, holds moisture and is sterile) Why comment on this? Because the seeds are up in 5 days and it looks like nearly 100% germination.

Daffodil's leaves should be turning brown by now, if not already done so. If they haven't, then leave a while longer. Before pulling out may I suggest a good feed to the bulbs while you know where they are and of course, if you are leaving them in the ground. If you prefer to lift the bulbs and store then make sure the bulbs you save are dry and clean and fungus free. Store in open mesh onion bags, if possible, in a dry but ventilated garage or shed, and don't forget to inspect them from time to time before planting time end of August/ beginning of September.

A few more jobs. If you have potatoes coming through then now is the time to earth-up. Tomatoes will need constant attention. Keep watering, once a week feed with Tomorite and if in a greenhouse ensure ventilation. If we have extended dryness and heat then pour a can of water onto the floor of the greenhouse in the early morning so that the evaporation humidifies the air. Grow Tagetes (French Marigolds or Nicotiana (tobacco plant) with your tomatoes to attract the white fly. They can be picked off on a leaf and destroyed. Again, with constant heat and dryness containerised plants will suffer, including hanging baskets. Where the original compost has shrunken top-up with a mulch of fresh compost and water frequently. If you have not fed them recently, then do so!!
