OPENING THOUGHTS

Dear Readers

It's a privilege to be asked to write what is expected to be the last message in the last issue of 'The Link' (at least for the time being). I'd like to say first how grateful we are to Melanie and those in whose steps she stands for their wonderful work in editing and publishing this means of communication. We're all aware how technology opens up new ways of communicating but for many of us something which is beautifully produced which we can hold in our hands is something we treasure – and will miss.

I've recently taken part in a conference (online) of Anglican mission agencies. The theme came from Psalm 30. 'Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning.' Weeping, lament, is something which the pandemic has highlighted. But we wept before Covid – and we'll weep afterwards. Lament is way we share together a sense of helplessness, frustration, rage. Speakers at the conference reflected on this passage from Psalm 30 in the light of their own contexts, on small Pacific islands threatened by rising sea levels, countries where only a small percentage have received vaccination, regions experiencing drought; abuse: we can add to the litany of disasters – Afghanistan...

But the Psalmist exclaims 'weeping may linger ... but joy comes with the morning'. This is a message of hope, hope, not wishful thinking. It's something the Psalmist is confident about, and so should we. December sees us looking to Christmas. It's the season of waiting we call Advent. Christmas is festival when Christians celebrate God's coming among us in flesh –'incarnate'. 'Joy to the world, the Saviour comes' is one of the carols we may well sing. God's coming changes things; lament is assuaged, our hurting is consoled.

Some of us may feel quite indifferent to the world's pain. We may have survived the pandemic relatively unscathed in our beautiful part of the country. Former Archbishop Rowan Williams said to us attending the conference, 'Good theology is the kind of talk about God that helps us see ourselves, our world with greater clarity . . . Good theology is what opens our eyes and our hearts.' He added, God has given us so many opportunities for learning and growing'. Behold and see.

As we read / hear the familiar stories of Jesus's incarnation notice how that invitation plays out. Shepherds, Magi... they come and see. Come and see the child lying in the manger' worship and adore. Come and see! May this season and this festival be a time of blessing for us all.

Farewell to The Link

This morning Frank and I received a letter from Sheila Green, wife of Rev. Brian Green, who sadly passed away in February of this year. Brian and Sheila lived in the village for many years and although retired Brian became almost a full-time priest in Widworthy during one of our long Interregnums. In the April/May Link of this year I published a section of Brian's story from our 2006 'Offwell Village Tales'. Someone from the village forwarded Sheila the Link and she was writing to thank us, if rather belatedly, due to the great number of cards of condolence she had received.

As we look to publish our final Link Sheila's letter is a reminder to me of how important a part The Link has played over the years in keeping both past and present residents of the Parish informed and connected, whether it was the Covid Reflections by Bishop Oliver and Mrs. Legg, photos of the Benefice Coffee Mornings, or Marion and Barbara dressed in their finery for 'Open the Book'. Then there are memories of bell ringing on Devon Historic Churches Day, posies presented on Mothering Sunday, the school childrens' paintings for Harvest Festival, Remembrance and Christmas services; not forgetting Offwell Flower Show.

When St. Mary's doors were closed in 2020 we commemorated VE Day75 outdoors, while the glorious summer weather enabled St. Cuthbert's to hold their Sunday services (including the Remembrance Day service) in the church grounds. In Widworthy the White Ensign flew on VE Day in memory of the Naval Officers who contributed so much to the life of St. Cuthbert's Church.

During lockdown, when everyone was spending more time at home and the natural world became more important than ever, villagers sent their garden photos to The Link to brighten up the lives of those who were unable to get out for their daily exercise. It was also a way in which we could remember so many past residents, including Rev. Green and Terry Staunton.

At the start of 2020 Matthew Schofield, son of Tim Schofield, vicar of Offwell Parish from 1986 to 1994, contacted the Link about his father's impending retirement. He was asking for any villagers who remembered his father to contribute memories and photos for a book he was hoping to produce to mark his parents' work across the various churches they had been connected to. Tim was a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists and he and his family would provide spectacular musical entertainment at Harvest Supper each year.

The Link has provided all of us with many happy memories of Parish life over the years and we must thank past editors, Jim Hudson and Nick Hill, as well as the present editor, Melanie Jolly, for all their time, hard work and commitment. We will try to continue to tell these stories over the coming years via the Offwell website.

NEW PLAYPARK FOR OFFWELL

After five years of planning and fund raising, Offwell's new Play Park has been officially opened by Damien Richards, Secretary of the Offwell Recreation Ground & Village Hall Committee (ORG&VHC).



It was back in 2016 that the committee decided to replace the old play park with its well-used contents. In March 2017 a subcommittee was formed and the long arduous business of fund raising began. Two village families, along with villagers from outside Offwell, started hosting Big breakfasts, cream teas, gardeners' question times, school competitions, quiz nights, pie, mash and pint – the ideas and

events just kept coming in. The sum of £4,500 had to be raised before match funding could be applied for; a long, slow process but we made it to the finals with Avia, receiving £1,000, followed by £2,000 from Tesco's Community Grants. Towards the end of 2017 carol singing was held in the Sports & Social Club and this attracted around 70 villagers - a great event to finish the year off.

With Covid arriving in 2020 we had to seriously rethink our initial aim to raise $\pounds 66,000$. With so many fund raising ventures closing their doors, and even the monthly donations from Offwell Fish n' Chips ending, it was decided to approach a local company, Design Create Play Ltd., who could design bespoke play structures at a more affordable price.

At the end of 2020 local businessman, Rich Dare, delivered 60 tons of top soil and CSW Groundworks very kindly completed all the ground works for free. By April the soil was seeded and the area was hand rolled by young men from the village. We were nearing the end - but then came the wood shortage and increase in costs.


There were some great challenges along the way but we finally made it and couldn't have asked for better weather at the Grand Opening in September, a day we shared with Offwell PTFA's Summer Treasure Hunt. By Bonfire Night the final piece, the Pirate Ship, was in place and the Play Park is now complete; something to be proud of and loved by all the children that visit.

A massive thank-you to everyone who helped and supported us over the last five years, no

helped and supported us over the last five years, no matter how big or small, because without you there would be no play park for our children to enjoy.

The Christmas Mystery by Jostein Gaarder

One day Elisabet, while Christmas shopping with her mother, vanishes into thin air. Accompanied by angels, shepherds, kings and even a Roman governor, she is rushing back through time and space to Bethlehem, to be present at the birth of Christ. Fifty years later a boy called Joachim pieces together her story from a magic advent calendar and brings it to a conclusion.

I read this (for the second time) last December as a 'Lockdown Lift' during a difficult Christmas period. It's an intriguing and inspiring story for adults and children. Each chapter opens a window on the advent calendar so could be read daily throughout December in the lead up to Christmas day.

As well as telling the Christmas story and a modern day mystery, the author takes us on a journey of discovery about the history of Christianity in different parts of the world.

If you're interested in philosophy and want it easily explained, as to a fourteen year old girl, then I also highly recommend 'Sophie's World' by the same author.

Who found you in the green forest and were you very sorry to come away? see I will comfort you because you smell so sweetly


I will kiss your cool bark and hug you safe and tight just as your mother would, only don't be afraid
