BENEFICE NEWS

As we enter the Harvest season when we give thanks for the bounty of the earth and the safe harvest of the fruits and vegetables that nourish us, we should also reflect on the harvest of our spiritual food and our relationship with God. We need to appraise whether our relationship with Him is what and where it should be. In Jeremiah 2:13, He warns, "My people have committed two sins: They have forsaken me, the spring of living waters and have dug their own cisterns, broken cisterns that cannot hold water." This is a powerful metaphor for people who live in hot dry countries where much of the day can be taken up walking, sometimes long distances, to draw water and storing it in cisterns. There, the water heats up and soon becomes stagnant. When we were living in the bush on the edge of the Zambezi flood plain, much of each morning was spent boiling the drinking water for the day on our wood stove, then when cool, passing it through a filter to remove the mud and other debris from the stream. This is much like the refining fires we need to pass through to come to a closer understanding and walk with God. He is the fountain of living water that never runs dry and always is fresh and spiritually refreshing. We too build unsound cisterns in our lives that hold our love of money, good times and good things, putting ourselves on pedestal of good works we hope will reward us in our lifetime. This harvest we must turn back to the God of living waters that flow through all eternity, from God's covenant with his chosen people in the Old Testament, in the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Chris and through our lives today if we are open to it and live by his teachings.

Our last entry in The Link dwelt upon the problems a local school faces with funding. This month we want to talk about how much help we get from our community to allow us to provide the high quality education which is our aim.

At Offwell we are fortunate to have a pro-active fundraising group known as the PTFA (Parent, Teacher and Friends Association). The PTFA is a small group formed from the school community who meet regularly to plan interesting and fun activities/experiences all designed to raise money for the benefit of the children at Offwell School. Last financial year this group's efforts raised an impressive £3000 which has contributed towards some excellent improvements for the children.

Most recently their support has allowed us to re-join the School Library Service. Under this scheme we will be able to p rovide topic books/artefacts for the children to support their themed learning; 200 new books will come into school and be exchanged regularly keeping class libraries vibrant and interesting; an audit of our existing libraries to make sure we are keeping up with current fiction and non-fiction. This is hugely exciting as they have also released funds for us to upgrade our library areas – Oak Class has new shelving and a few chairs and the children are proud of this new environment.






